**Ulu Archive Project:** Karen Mullen and Diane Gee have agreed to co-chair a group to create a 'University Lutheran Archive' and you are invited to help! This long-term, ongoing project will include (among other things):

- transcribing/scanning/copying historical church documents
- sorting and scanning pictures
- determining ways to make pictures available for review and identification of people in them
- creating a digital data organizational scheme that can be searched, hopefully online/via the website
- organizing content within the defined structure
- providing archive content for online access/search
- creating 'histories' (stories & supporting archive materials), around specific segments of University Lutheran history, such as 'Ulu, the Building,' Choir & Music, Bible Studies, International Ministries, Missions, Performances, Community Involvement, etc.

The primary intent is to create a digital archive, but many of the physical papers need to be preserved, in archival scrapbooks or other media preservation materials; and, some of the materials may be appropriate for framing/display within the church. 
