**Next Meeting – November 11:** At the next LWML meeting, on Wednesday, November 11, 7pm, we will work on making chrismsons, as well as hold elections for next year's officers. Please plan to attend, if possible.



**Help Assemble T-Shirt Backpacks:** The LWML is requesting assistance with assembling no sew t-shirt backpacks to donate to Ysleta Lutheran Mission. If you might be willing to help, please pick up a backpack project bag after worship. The bag contains a cord, t-shirt, and instructions on how to assemble the backpack. You can then assemble the backpacks at home and bring them back to church so that we can send them off to the children at Ysleta. You can return the assembled backpacks to the church office any time.

**Operation Christmas Child:** LWML is participating in Operation Christmas child again this year. We are asking members to donate school supplies, coloring books, and small toys, and will hold a work day on November 7, 10am-12pm, to pack boxes. Alex teaches Bible stories and English to 150 students in a dilapidated building with very little air flow, working with other volunteers to meet the needs of the children. Jean Bristol, who met Alex while on a ULu-sponsored mission trip in July, said of her time visiting with Alex: "Alex needs all kinds of supplies and is very dedicated to these children. The children are very happy and love to be with him. All the children were giving us 'high fives' and clustered around us.
